The presentation will describe the organization of Science Magazine and its publisher, the American Association for the Advancement of Science and their position in the rapidly evolving world of electronic publishing. Dr Ray will discuss the how manuscripts are processed at Science. He will provide suggestions on strategies that successful authors use to prepare and present papers that are ultimately accepted for publication after the rigorous peer review process.

Bryan Ray has worked as an editor at Science for over 20 years. He currently a Senior Editor at Science and was the Founding Editor of Science Signaling. Bryan was trained as an undergraduate at the University of California at Berkeley, and received his PhD from the University of Virginia. As a postdoc at UVa Tom Sturgill, Bryan discovered the widely studied enzyme known as "MAP kinase". Bryan handles papers on topics that include signal transduction, systems biology, protein and gene networks, cell cycle, apoptosis, metabolism, circadian rhythms, and aging. When he's not marking papers with red ink, Bryan is an avid amateur photographer and Nikon fan.
